On signing the Treaty on Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons in Moscow

The XXII continuing session of the UN General Assembly on 12 Jun 1968 approved the Treaty on Non-Proliferation on Nuclear Weapons. It is envisioned that the depository governments for this treaty will be the Soviet Union, the United States of America and Great Britain.
