Meeting Minutes Regarding ISSA (Israel-South Africa Agreement)

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Summary:

Minutes from the third ISSA meeting between representatives of the Israeli and South African governments, including Ministers Botha and Peres. Missile delivery systems and other military equipment are discussed.

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8.2.3 Total in one or other country.

- 9 Minister Botha said that he insisted on being able to withdraw from the project - i.e. being able to proceed in phases.

Minister Peres took note. His staff will make proposals on how this can be achieved.

- 10 Minister Botha expressed interest in a limited number of units of Chalet ^{which he} ~~provide~~ the correct payload ~~could be provided~~; Minister Peres said that the correct payload was available in three sizes. Minister Botha expressed his appreciation and said that he would ask for advice.

- 11 Minister Botha said that we have no aggressive intentions and hence Burglar is for us a low priority, even the 3 000 km model. It was stated that the 6 000 km model proposal had been made at the request of R.S.A.

- 12 Minister Peres asked that R.S.A. should declare their interest in BlueBat and Olive. Minister Botha undertook to do this.

- 13 Minister Peres asked that R.S.A. should declare their interest in Night Vision equipment. Minister Botha undertook to do so. →

- 14 Minister Peres offered half of their production of 10 units per month of the new tank to R.S.A. Production to commence in ^{Tan} June 1976, although ^{and supply during} mention was also made ^{for} of December 1976. ~~DEFENCE INTELLIGENCE~~

The cost of the tank was stated to be \$ 810 000 including development charges and based on an ^{production from Jan 13 JUL 2006} order for 1 000 units.

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
