SUBJECT: INITIATION OF DISCUSSIONS WITH THE GERMAN, NETHERLANDS, AND U.K. GOVERNMENTS REGARDING CONTROL OF GAS CENTRIFUGE INFORMATION AND SCHTTTENT

I refer to previous correspondence between the Commission and the Department, subject: "Control of and Cooperation in Gas Centrifuge Research and Development Technology."

The Commission has now considered this problem, including your preliminary views transmitted to Hr. Wells by memorandum of March 23, 1960, and the discussions which took place April 1. The Commission feels that emploratory discussions should be initiated promptly with the German, Butch, and U.K. Governments to seek control of gas centrifuge equipment and materials and control of contrifuge technology.

I therefore recommend that the Department take appropriate steps as expeditiously as possible to arrange discussions with these three Covernments. In this regard, it would, in our judgment, be most desirable to held such discussions in Europe. In view of the delicacy of both the classification and the political problems involved, we suggest a mission made up of representatives of the Department and the Commission.

If these suggestions meet with your approval, I would appreciate your DR. designating a members of your staff to join with Mr. Wells on an urgent basis to do the necessary preparatory work.
