
Sir:

To us all here in Korea and specially to the Secretariat of the World Anti-Communist League the fact that 11 passengers including the pilot, the co-pilot, the crew and several of the passengers of the ill-fated Y.S.-11 of the Korean Air Lines which was hijacked to North Korea by Communists is not only a violation of international law but also of common decency.

The fact too that the said plane has not been returned to the Korean Air Lines is very regrettable indeed. I think that the Communists in North Korea must be convinced by now that Korea is progressing by leaps and bounds and must not be prevented.

Another thing that calls for immediate retaliation is the fact that the communists of North Korea have placed an order for disease germs in Tokyo so that they may use them in biological warfare against the helpless and hapless South Koreans. Both the Red Cross and United Nations must help us.

We want both entities to come to the rescue of the poor people of Korea who want only be left alone. U.N. and Red Cross, please awake!
