SOUTH AFRICAN TEST EXPLOSIONS

You told me that the Prime Minister had taken very seriously the report that the South Africans might be making next month one or more non-nuclear test explosions at their site in the Kalahari Desert and wished to send a warning to Mr Vorster which might take the form of a personal message.

We have consulted Sir D Scott who is here on leave. His report was based on an informal conversation with Mr Brand Fourie, Secretary for External Affairs. Sir D Scott advises against a personal message from the Prime Minister Mr Vorster bypassing Mr Fourie because this might severely damage Sir D Scott's relationship with Mr Fourie.

Sir D Scott advises that the message should be sent through our Chargé d'Affaires in Pretoria, Mr David Summerhayes with instructions for him to approach Mr Fourie.

I attach a draft telegram accordingly.
